	The course aims to place the care of patients with chronic diseases, particularly	
	the very elderly with multimorbidity and those in advanced stages of disease in	
	which it is reasonable to expect a poor prognosis in the relatively short term,	
	within a framework that takes into account not only biomedical aspects related	
	to the diseases but also those concerning the psychological, relational and	
	spiritual suffering of the patient and of those who care for them.	
	In particular, the course aims to train social-health professionals for various roles	
	and with varied skills, who can operate at different levels of care: general	
	medicine, Palliative Care Units, homes, hospices, and in public and private (profit	
	and non-profit) territorial services.	
	To this end, the training activities will be divided into three main areas, Vision,	
	Action, Organization, which will in turn be declined into Reason-Culture-	
	Sentiments, Places-Patients-Techniques, and Team-Network-System. The major	
	issues of chronicity, oncology, and geriatrics will be considered and placed in	
	epidemiological, biological, social, and cultural contexts. The course will be held	
	in the mode in which the epidemiological situation allows; should impediments	
	to the movement of students and faculty arise due to the continuing health	
	emergency determined by the COVID-19 pandemic, modules may also be taught	
	online via a platform to be defined.	
	At the end of the course, students will have the appropriate knowledge to identify	
	patients and their end-of-life needs as a complex whole requiring the integration of different professional skills. In general, students will acquire a palliative culture	
	that can impact and transform how they act in care settings.
