RESEARCH PROJECT	The research project (between 8.000 and 12.000 characters, without spaces), drafted in Italian, English or French, shall fit within one of the curricula (that must be identified in the application), specify the object of the research, clarify to what extent it can be considered original, shortly describe the state of the art in the field (with proper bibliographical references) and identify the research lines that the candidate thinks can be usefully pursued along the three years of the doctoral course.  For the applications referring to the positions with "The preliminary reference procedure as a keystone for assessing the relationships between EU law and national legal systems" and "The evolution of EU competences following the pandemic: new directions in the light of solidarity and sustainability" as specific research topics the project can be only drafted in English.  The candidate can either submit the same research project for the standard positions and for the positions with specific research topics or submit several separate projects. The application must, however, clearly specify to which position refers each project.

In the case of the applications referring to the positions with "The preliminary reference procedure as a keystone for assessing the relationships between EU law and national legal systems" and "The evolution of EU competences following the pandemic: new directions in the light of solidarity and sustainability" as specific research topics the interview can be held only in English.

FURTHER INFORMATION ON THE EVALUATION PROCESS	The assessment of titles, experiences and publications will be based respectively on 1) the relevance for the specific research area and in-depth nature (for the final degree paper and the publications) and 2) the time employed (for titles and post-degree specializations or research experiences). The assessment of the research project will be based mainly on its originality and methodological soundness.  The interview will be assessed on the basis of the capacity to effectively present the research project, and to provide evidence of the knowledge of the related topics.			
THEMATICS	Beyond the presentation of the research project, the interview can also include a short discussion on topics that can be deemed relevant for the curriculum or for the research topics identified for the scholarships with separate rankings.
