	and his or her family and friend group. In particular, the course intends to	
	provide the cultural, organizational, and professional tools to refine and	
	disseminate a palliative-centric sensibility that considers the significant issues	
	of chronicity and geriatrics, framed from both epidemiological and biological, as	
	well as social and cultural perspectives. The course aims to frame the care of	
	patients with chronic diseases, particularly the very elderly with multimorbidity	
	and those in advanced stages of disease in which it is reasonable to expect a	
	poor prognosis in the relatively short term, from a perspective that takes into	
	account not only the biomedical aspects related to the diseases but also those	
	concerning the psychological, relational and spiritual suffering, of the person	
	concerned and those who care for them.	
	Specifically, the course aims to train social-health professionals in various roles	
	and skills, acting at different levels of care: general medicine, Palliative Care	
	Units, home, hospice, and in public and private (profit and nonprofit) territorial	
	services.	
	To this end, the training activities will be divided into three major sections,	
	Vision, Action, Organization, which in turn will be declined into Reason-Culture-	
	Sentiments; Places-Patients-Techniques; and Team-Network-System. The major	
	issues of chronicity, oncology, and geriatrics will be considered and framed	
	epidemiologically, biologically, socially, and culturally. The course will be held in	
	the mode in which the epidemiological situation makes it feasible; should	
	impediments to the movement of learners and faculty arise due to the	
	continuing health emergency caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the conduct	
	of the Modules may also take place remotely via a platform to be defined.	
	At the end of the course, learners will have the appropriate knowledge to	
	identify patients and frame their needs toward the end of life from the	
	perspective of complexity and the necessary organizational relationships to	
	integrate different professional skills. More generally, participants will acquire	
	that palliative culture that can impact and transform how they act in these care	
	settings.
