To experience direct and practical knowledge of the methodology of applying RE in individuals with neuromotor and mental pathology in various rehabilitation and sports settings. Gain expertise in the morphological, behavioral, biomechanical, and biodynamic assessment of the horse for its selection according to the neuromotor and psychic characteristics of the subject. Acquire competence in managing the horse, the stable/riding environment, and the equestrian technique useful for RE intervention in its various disciplines. Acquire knowledge of how to exercise the specific roles of the RE Team, their function, and how to integrate them for the purpose of acquiring the theoretical-practical skills for multidisciplinary integration
	of the work in Teams proper to IAA and in particular RE. Observational activity. 450 total hours of internship.
